Expectations of Christmas

If you're concerned about Christmas spending this year, you are not alone -More than half (53%) of us think it will be a stressful Christmas due to the cost-of-living crisis Don't plan the 'perfect' Christmas first work out what you can afford

This will not only help you to manage their expectations, but it will help your children to learn to appreciate the value of saving and a sense of achievement when they get the item they desire. Making gifts and creating your own wrapping can save you money and be so much fun! - Get the children involved and let their Christmas creativity shine


Receiving home-made gifts is so special and can be treasured for years to come
